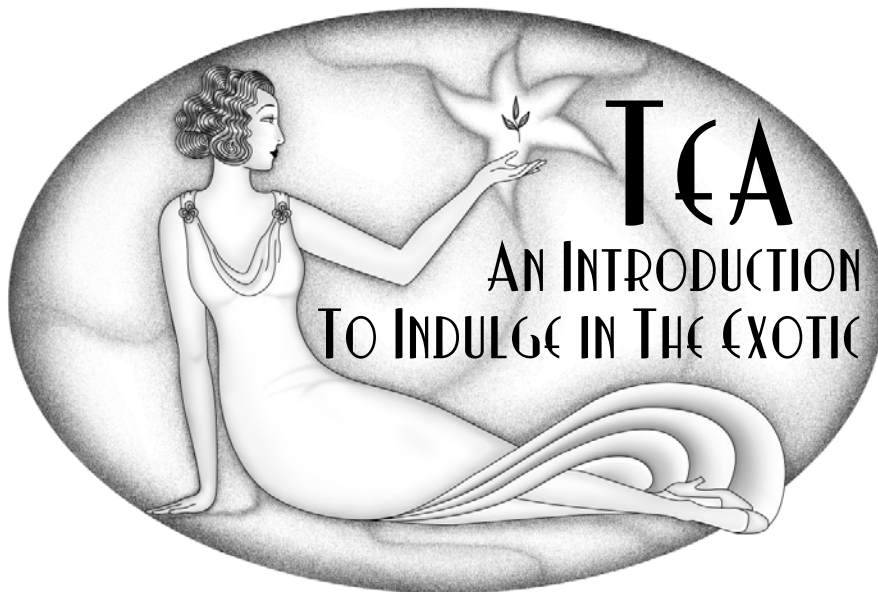

White Teas:

White Pekoe Needles: Fujian, China - Hand-plucked

White tea is a class unto itself. It is neither steamed nor oxidized and comes mainly from the Fujian province. Exotic Tea Room white tea is from a small two-acre garden in a hilly/mountainous region of the North Fujian province. The garden is approximately 3,500 feet above sea level. A delicate light green and white leaf, this tea is picked and produced in late March. Most white teas are very attractive but have no flavor. Not this one. This flashy leaf tea produces a mild sweet cup.

Bai Mu Dan: China - Hand-plucked

Literally translated as "White Peony", this tea's pale orange-yellow liquor pleases the eye while the delicate sweet cup delights the palate.

Green Teas:

Decaff Sencha: China - CO₂ Decaff Process & Hand-plucked

The base tea is a China Green "Sencha-style" leaf. The CO₂ process is most obvious on this leaf style in that finished product maintains the original leaf appearance and refreshing green cup quality. CO₂ is the only process considered natural and is more gentle to the tea leaves and has no toxic residues. 99% caffeine free

Emerald Sencha: Shizuoka, Japan

Shizuoka (Tranquil hills) is just Southwest of Tokyo. The immaculate gardens line cliffs along the sea and go up to the foothills of Mt. Fuji. Shizuoka's premium teas are famous in Japan and almost half of the classic style green teas grown in Japan come from this area. Tea has been cultivated in this region from the Kamakura Period (1185 AD). The result is centuries of un-ending and accumulated tea growing and processing wisdom and mastery. We believe you will taste millennium of artistry in this tea. Usually steamed and machine-fired, Sencha has a shiny or semi-polished appearance. This very classic Japanese Sencha has the shiny natural leaf with a bright green flavor.

Sunrise Gyokuro: Uji, Japan

Gyokuro literally translated means Pearl Dew. This tea represents the finest non-ceremonial tea produced in Japan. This tea is grown where the first Japanese tea was planted in the Uji district of Honshu near Kyoto. The tea is picked from old bushes that are shaded to reduce the affects of photosynthesis. Everything connected with tending and making the tea is done by hand. A bright and lovely cup, this tea is a treat at any time. This is Japanese tea at its finest level and offers an outstandingly smooth and lightly sweet cup.

Lung Ching/Dragon Well 1st Grade: Hangzhou, China - Hand-plucked

Lung Ching translated means Dragon's Well. The legend of its name comes from a story around 250 AD when the farmers of the Hangzhou region had been praying for rain and discovered a dragon lurking near a spring in the hills. They implored the dragon to come to their rescue. Instantly, clouds came rushing in from all sides and poured forth timely rain. On this account, the temple adjoining the spring is known as Dragon's Well Monastery, and the tea derives its name from the same legend. The finest Lung Ching is produced only near the beautiful West Lake of Hangzhou. The leaf is remarkably flat and smooth and is slick to the touch. Dragon Well gives a light emerald liquor with a most intriguing vegetative aroma and mellow, sweet taste.

Dragon Phoenix Jasmine Pearls: Fuding, Fujian, China - Hand-plucked

Tea enriched with the fragrance of jasmine flowers has been a favorite since the Sung Dynasty, 800 years ago. Tea is picked in April/May and processed by hand by rolling each leaf and a bud into tiny pearl size balls. Once rolled, the tea is wrapped in silk mesh and dried by fire to set the form. The tea is then held until August/September when the finest jasmine blossoms are in bloom. Jasmine flowers are picked before noon and set-aside until evening when the petals begin to open in the cool night air. Once open, "marrying" of the jasmine to the tea happens in two applications after which the jasmine petals are removed. This is unquestionably one of the finest jasmynes shipped from the port of fuzhou.

Gunpowder Special Imperial Grade: Zhejiang, China - Hand-plucked

Gunpowder tea gets its name from the appearance of the leaves, which are rolled tightly into small, round pellets ranging from Pinhead to Pea Leaf. The smaller the roll, the more expensive the tea. The tight roll helps Gunpowder remain fresher, longer than other teas. The cup is of medium body.

Oolong is often the personal choice of many professional tea tasters. This Oolong is hand picked once a year, when the flavor is at its finest. The leaves are naturally curly and the tender sprouts are picked during the peak of summer. This tea is a compromise between black and green tea. The leaves are only partly oxidized and turn a dark emerald green. This very lightly oxidized Oolong (less than 10%) is so sweet and floral you would think that it was perfume instead of tea. The cup is slightly buttery and nutty with a smooth finish and medium bodied mouth feel. This is our most popular tea.

In Yunnan, likely the most culturally diverse province of China, you find in the Southern tip equa-distant from Laos, Burma and Vietnam the Jing Mai Mountains and its wild forest of ancient tea trees. This forest is a national treasure made of trees 1000 years old. The Bulang and Dai hill tribes have enjoyed the area's teas for more than 1300 years. These tea trees are wild unspoiled by machine or chemical cultivation. This is a unique tea that supports an indigenous natural heritage. The tea's tippy base is unusual as a pairing for jasmine but works wonderfully; to find a heavily oxidized Oolong based jasmine tea is unique. This tea yields a beautiful caramel colored liquor and provides an uncommonly smooth and sweet base that balances with, but is not over-powered by the rich jasmine taste.

This is a very exotic tea. Overall the character is mild, with rich nutty notes and a light sweetness with green overtones, and its story is just as amazing. In late 1949 a portion of Chiang-kei Shek's Nationalist Army in Yunnan became separated from the main force. Isolated but not dispirited, these soldiers led guerilla raids against the People's Liberation Army. Eventually however, they were driven south into northern Thailand. For decades, displaced they ran illegal operations in the Golden Triangle like gem and drug smuggling. Eventually, a new generation of these Chinese immigrants assimilated culturally and economically into Thai society. Tea growing was one of the new economic activities chosen. Today, what began as a small Chinese enclave engrossed in illegal activities in the hills surrounding Mae Salong Village, has now become a legitimate, cohesive, economic community, dotted with independent tea gardens producing Oolong tea. This tea is sought after by exclusive Thai hotels, spas, and specialty stores. A portion of the best leaf is exported. It is still virtually unknown in the U.S.

Origin: Fujian, China. Ti Kwan Yin means Iron Goddess of Mercy. Produced in the Mt. Wu Yi Shan region, Fujian (Fukien) province, China's oolong teas tend to be more heavy and full-bodied, compared to their Formosa counterparts. Most recently this tea has been called "Wu-Long" by some purveyors which is another way to say "Oolong". The tea bushes from which these Oologns are picked are short, spreading shrubs with glossy, dark green leaves with curling, serrated edges. The tightly twisted leaves produce an aromatic, amber liquor that has an invigorating, full-bodied sweet taste with a long-lingering aftertaste. The health benefits from this tea are the same or similar to all Oolong teas.

The oxidation of this base tea is between 20–25%, making this a very green and sweet Oolong. The tight roll is reminiscent of Tung Ting Oolong from Formosa. This tea is scented in the same manner as Jasmine teas but with Magnolia petals and annually very little is made.

Pu-erh Tea:

Named for the county in Yunnan province, China where the tea originated from and is still produced, Pu-erh represents one of the tea industries most unusual products. It is the only tea that is specifically processed to age; highly sought Pu-erhs are decades to a century old. Famed for its medicinal properties it is often taken for relief of indigestion. Recent modern medical tests have linked it to a reduction in cholesterol, which has made it popular in France. The aging processes changes the compounds in the leaf and over time, it decaffeinate naturally. It can be loose leaf, but is often marketed in pressed cakes or bowls called toucha ("bird's nest"). This Pu-erh is milder than many and offers an earthy, complex, deep and lightly spicy bouquet with a lingering but smooth finish. If you love Cabernets then this is the tea for you.

Hubei Tea Bricks Large: Yunan, China	\$18.95/each

Origin: Hubei, Yunnan, China. Tea Bricks are produced by the same method used by the Chinese Ancients, to facilitate the transportation of their valued commodity by camel trains into Mongolia and Tibet. The Chinese are credited with being the earliest bankers – using notes and coins long before Western culture came into being. However, far-inland tribes had little use for paper money and used "Tea Money" for both bartering and consumption. It is said to be the earliest form of currency. Improved over the years with various designs impressed front and back, they are probably of more interest as an item of decoration and conversation than for brewing. Each brick is approximately 9.5"x7.25"x1" and weighs 2.5 pounds.

Congou, pronounced "Kon-goo," is a general name for all non-broken, well-made, black Chinese teas. Due to its superb bouquet, this north China black tea is often referred to as the "burgundy of teas." This full-bodied, sweet liquoring tea produces a dark red cup. Keemun is considered by many to be one of the best China black teas. It makes an excellent "English Breakfast" and is useful for ice tea, in that it does not cloud easily. Its basic character lends itself to aging. Hao Ya "A" is the fanciest premium Keemun available and recommended as only a self-drinking tea that is to be enjoyed on its own exceptional merits.

Very limited in quantity, 1st Flush teas are purchased during the peak of the season are flown into San Francisco, delivering the freshest tea anywhere in the world outside of the growing region. 1st Flush Teas have a very bright floral cup and are often compared to the young, Beaujolais production of wines. Puttabong estate teas are known for their very fresh, almost effervescently fresh and bright cups of Darjeeling and this tea is no exception.

In South India's Niligiri Mt. Basin in the area of Coimbatore, this lovely estate is nestled on the picturesque cloud-bathed slopes of the Anamallais, "Hill of the Elephants". Apply named, as the estate is also in the midst of Indira Gandhi's Wildlife Sanctuary, a habitat for some of the most exotic wildlife. The use of patented FBO (Fertilisation Bio-Organique) developed in France enables Iyerpadi to nurture a rich soil ecosystem without the use of pesticides or other harmful chemicals. This certified 100% Organic estate believes in treating the Earth well, and makes sure to treat its people well and as such is Fair Trade Certified. This whole leaf tea, has a sweet, mild cup with a slight bite.

Yunnan tea is from the province of the same name bordering Vietnam, Laos and Burma. The area is very mountainous and an indigenous area of tea. Teas from Yunnan range from typical black teas to amazingly colorful, "tippy" teas. Most have a "peppery" quality that is distinctively Yunnan. Yunnan teas are relatively new, as far as Chinese production efforts, having only been in commercial production since 1949. This Yunnan offers a strong brisk cup with spicy overtones and a lovely gold/black colored leaf.			
Nuwara Eliya OP: Nuwara Eliya, S. Sri Lanka – Hand-plucked	\$12.95/16¢ a cup	\$7.50/19¢ a cup	\$4.00/20¢ a cup
Nuwara Eliya is an oval shaped mountain valley, the plateau being 6,240 feet above sea level making it the highest grown of Ceylonese teas and famously produces tea with a unique flavor. The air is always scented with the fragrance of the cypress trees that grow in abundance and mentholated with the wild mint and eucalyptus. It is a combination of all these factors that produces a tea that is recognized by true connoisseurs. The tea's brew is lighter in color than typical Ceylons but has an exquisite flavor and aroma. It is said that Nuwara Eliya tea is to Ceylon tea what Champagne is to French wine. Wonderful straight or with milk and sugar.			
Sri Pada Sacred Mt. Black Gold: Sripada, Ratnapura, Sri Lanka – Hand-plucked	\$15.95/20¢ a cup	\$8.95/25¢ a cup	\$4.95/33¢ a cup
Centered in Sri Lanka's southern tea growing area is a sacred mountain called Adam's Peak by the English and Sripada by the locals. It is Buddhism's equivalent of Mt. Sinai and features n importance in Muslim, Hindu and Christian religions. It is nearly 7000 feet above sea level and the tea grown from its slopes is unique amongst Sri Lankan teas. The tea is a beautiful golden needle color and has such a smooth taste that is a straight drinking tea and can be enjoyed both hot or cold. Special Reserve – Limited Quantities

Our Kenyan tea hails from the family farms at the Southeast foothills of Mt. Kenya near Kangaita city. Our selection has strength and astringency that takes milk well and are similar to Ceylons in character. This Kenyan tea lends itself well to a hearty breakfast cup or a wonderful iced tea. Orthodox or whole leaf Kenyan teas are extremely rare and have only recently been in production. This tea has a mild taste with a possibly juniper berry note with a woody and lively nose.

Due to its superb bouquet, this north China black tea is often referred to as the "burgundy of teas." This full-bodied, sweet liquoring tea produces a dark red cup. Keemun is considered by many to be one of the best China black teas. It makes an excellent "English Breakfast" and is useful for ice tea, in that it does not cloud easily. Our Kenyan tea hails from the family farms at the Southeast foothills of Mt. Kenya near Kangaita city. Together these teas create a fantastic balance of color, character and aroma with fantastic strength and the ability to not cloud so perfect with milk or as an iced tea.

Rose Congou is a black whole well-made OP leaf scented in the same manner as Jasmine. It has a heavy, sweet cup with a distinct rose fragrance. The nose of the cup is much stronger than the taste. The rose petals, like Jasmine are merely for decoration and color. Unlike Jasmine, fewer petals in the tea do not relate to a higher quality. Rose Congou is shipped directly to the U.S. through the Chinese port of Fuzhou. This is the same port famous for its exports of Jasmine tea.			
Lapsang Souchong: 0 mei, Taiwan – Hand-plucked	\$19.95/29¢ a cup	\$11.95/34¢ a cup	\$5.95/39¢ a cup
This leaf is almost coral black with one of the largest leaf grades in the industry. Placing the final product over a smoldering fire of green pine needles flavors this tea. The Formosa varieties are lighter in cup but more heavily smoked than their counterparts from China. Often used in "Russian Caravan" blends, Lapsang Souchong is NEVER the cup for those that prefer a lighter, sweeter tea.

Herbal Tea:

Fruit teas and herbals, often referred to as tisanes, contain no tea. Fruit pieces, flower petals, herbs, spices and flavoring are combined to create colorful infusions. Often the use of hibiscus will give the liquor (steeped brew) a deep red color. Originally used as folk remedies and medicinals, these teas found new life in tea created for the children's market. Now tisanes are experiencing an increase in acceptance and enjoyment among consumers of all ages.

Chrysanthemum Flower: China - No caffeine Chrysanthemums were cultivated in China as a flowering herb as far back as the 15th century BC. The flower was introduced into Japan probably in the 8th century CE, and the Emperor adopted the flower as his official seal. The flower's steeped liquor is transparent and light yellow in color, with a floral aroma.
